

Climate Justice training for trainee teachers

An exercise in awareness raising

1. Description of project

Liverpool World Centre (working with TEESNet and funded by Oxfam) are looking to recruit 3 trainers to deliver a short (6hour) training course on Climate Justice to 25 trainee teachers per trainer, in spring 2022.

The training will introduce trainees to the concept of climate justice, through the lens of gender and human rights.

The 3 trainers will help shape the training, and be given the course materials, which are about enthusing trainees to find out more and explore ways to incorporate it into their teaching.

The project is not about creating a comprehensive training for teachers or a collection of teaching resources – but rather an opportunity to raise awareness amongst trainees about the subject.

The training can take place within an existing ITE module, or for students to take part in on a voluntary basis additional to students lectures etc.

The training is being planned to be delivered online, but it will be adaptable for face to face.

Overall Project outputs

- 1 x training programme for trainees to last 6 hours
- 100 trainees to receive training (divided into 4 sessions of 25 students in 4 different institutions)
- 4 short casestudies/feedback of how the training has influences teaching practices (placements etc)

2. Budget for trainer

3. Duration

4. Key Activities

- Contacting and recruiting potential HEIs/ teacher trainees (now-December 2021)
- attending initial information scoping event 17th November 2pm (2.5hours)
- Collection of baseline (perhaps in first session)

- Delivery of training to 25 trainees (January – March 2022)
- Collection of end line information and evidence for case studies (March-April 2022)

5. Trainer specification

Due to the timeline of this project, there will be a requirement that the trainer has some prior experience/connections in initial teacher education. The potential trainer will need to have:

- Existing contacts with HEIs
- Experience of teaching/training/ working with trainee teachers
- Experience of delivering GTA or any similar online training
- Availability to attend 17th November and deliver project in 2022

6. Method of application

Please write a short (250-500 word) application setting out:

1. Your experience teaching/training/ working with trainee teachers (please name institutions)
2. Experience of delivering GTA or any similar online training
3. How you propose to recruit 25 trainee teachers for training delivery in January 2022 (which institutions you would approach)
4. How confident are you to be able to secure a training with your local ITE provider, and complete the training with 25 student completers? (explain your reasons)
5. Do you have any issues with the dates (especially 17th November 2-5.30pm)
